Dear SVCS Families,

November 30, 2020

Madison County Health Department notified the District today of another student that tested positive for COVID-19. Due to privacy laws, we are not able to share the identity of the individual or any details of their case.

The District has been working in coordination with the Madison County Health Department to conduct an investigation and support their contact tracing efforts. The Madison County Health Department believes this case is an instance of community spread.

Due to the number of faculty and students that are quarantined, the District shifted to complete virtual learning beginning Monday, November 30, 2020. This second COVID case will require the district to remain with virtual learning for one more day. The district will return to in-person learning on Wednesday, December 9, 2020.

Since Madison Oneida BOCES is currently open for in person learning, the district will transport our students to Madison Oneida BOCES CTE classes and to Madison Oneida BOCES Special Program classes. The district will continue to closely monitor this situation and will stay in close communication with local and state health officials to ensure we are taking all the appropriate steps.

As always, the health and safety of students and staff is a priority, and we appreciate your continued support.
